- 25 Buffaloes: Average 8–10 litres per day each  $\rightarrow$  Rs.60 per litre.

By selling directly to cooperatives, hotels, and local markets, Lucky avoids middlemen and secures fair prices. His annual income now runs into multiple crores, positioning him as one of Punjab's most successful dairy entrepreneurs.

#### **Beyond Milk: Value-Added Ventures**

Lucky Singh has expanded into value-added products such as paneer, ghee, curd, and butter. He also supplies directly to hotels and restaurants and runs a packaged milk brand. This diversification boosts profits and provides employment for local youth.



#### **Sustainable Practices**

- -Biogas Plant: Converts animal waste into clean fuel.
- Vermicompost Unit: Produces organic manure
- Fodder Crops: Grown to reduce feeding costs and maintain livestock health.
